### A Word From Pastor Tee

Dear Bloomville UMC, Hobart UMC, First Presbyterian Church of Stamford, and Township UMC:

Thank you to many of you who have prayed and welcomed me to your home. I can feel your warm hospitality extended to me. Some of you are still waiting and learning about me. Whatever the case is, I thank you for giving me this chance to come to serve God alongside around your beautiful mountains in this well-loved region.

I have travelled afar from Thailand since 2018 to different places, borders, and countries for Christian Missions. One day I was convicted when I was reading the Book of Romans, which led me to experience the genius loving God in Paul's Letters and that prompted me to attend seminary. Until I have received my Master of Divinity in June 2022 from Duke Divinity School in North Carolina, I have served as a pastoral intern and an active member at New CreatiFiron UMC in Durham, NC for two years and then as a hospital chaplain at University of North Carolina Hospitals in Chapel Hill, NC. It was this local church experience in North Carolina that has pivoted my trajectory from being a missionary to being a pastor who loves church to administer Word, Sacrament, Order, and Service to God's people and the Kingdom of God.

Growing up in a non-Christian family, I searched for God since I was a teenager in a junior high school so by God's grace that found me, I have followed Christ since then and attended church ever since my childhood until today that I have just turned 37 years old last month.

I had searched for God at an early age, and I found Christ through a testimony flyer at Christmas when I was in junior high school. I started attending church since then and was

involved in different youth ministries until I attended college where I studied abroad in Kansas, USA, where I called it my second conversion. While I studied in Kansas, I took the time every week to grow my fellowship with worshiping at college Christian fellowships and serving with the Presbyterian PCUSA church for Hispanic and migrant workers in Kansas and traveled as far as New York from the Midwest for a mission trip in the inner city of the Bronx and Manhattan. God answered my prayer to return to the United States on a scholarship for a master's degree in International Development in Ithaca, New York, which allowed me to complete and gain my skills and experience, with the degree, in serving the refugees and migrant workers on the Thailand-Myanmar borders. I worked for many years as a researcher, project coordinator, and consultant for non-profit organizations and corporations, but I knew that I was experiencing something growing in my heart and that is to take care of God's people and to grow God's church.

I arrived here in mid-August 2022, with good help from Stamford church to settle down well in the parsonage in Stamford. I have always wondered and intrigued to introduce myself to you in person. We are also getting to the end of our time in the US before we fly back to Togo. We thank you for praying for each step of this process and now for us to finish strong as we prepare to transition back to West Africa with new skills and a renewed energy to jump in and help our team in ministry.

Our team has gone through its own transitions with many of our colleagues who have left and several new ones who have joined. This summer our team in Togo is relying heavily on short term medical help before many of our career missionaries return in the fall. Pray for this summer as the medical staff functions with few reserves.

We are excited to get back for Alain to jump into working in the Outpatient Clinic and in the Emergency/Urgency Department and for Katherine to step into a teaching role at the MK school to help fill some teacher needs over this next year. The kids, of course, are excited to get back as well!

We have a busy schedule filled with lots of travel. We will be traveling to Spring Creek Church in Milwaukee followed by a trip to Georgia to visit with Katherine's parents and grandmother and on to Orlando to attend a medical conference.
